To Propose Workshops:

Following the regular NIPS program, workshops on current topics in Neural Information Processing will be held on Dec 1-2, 1989, at Keystone, a nearby ski resort. Proposals by qualified individuals interested in chairing one of these workshops are solicited. Interested parties should submit a short proposal including a title and a description of what the workshop is to address and accomplish as well as a resume of the prospective workshop chair. **Deadline for submission of workshop proposals is May 30, 1989.**

This is the third meeting of a high quality, relatively small, interdisciplinary conference which brings together neuro-scientists, engineers, physicists, cognitive scientists and mathematicians interested in all aspects of neural processing and computation. Plenary, contributed and poster sessions will be held. There will be no parallel sessions. The full text of presented papers will be published.

To Submit Papers:

Authors should submit four copies of 1000 word summary and four copies of a single page 100 word abstract clearly stating the results of their original research. Specify which of the five broad categories listed below best applies to your paper. Indicate your category on the abstract and at the end of the summary. Failure to do so will delay processing of your submission.

Categories are:

- Neuroscience
- Architecture Design
- Learning
- Applications
- Implementation and Simulation

Deadline for submission of summaries and abstracts is May 30, 1989.
